## KEEP WARM AND SAFE

December, January and February are the deadliest months for home fires, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). Heating equipment is the second leading cause of home fires and home fire deaths. That is why it is important for you and your loved ones to take extra precautions during the winter. Thinking of buying a space-heater? The NFPA recommends that you make sure it carries the mark of an independent testing laboratory and that you install it according to the manufacturer's instructions or have it professionally installed.

## HOLIDAY DECORATIONS—January 15th

Holiday Decorations are to be removed and properly stored by January 15th, at this time please make sure that there are no visible, hooks, staples, hangers or other hardware attached after the decorations are removed.

If you have a Christmas tree that needs to be recycled, Placentia Disposal will recycle your Christmas tree at no additional cost. Cut up your holiday tree and place it inside your "yard waste" container or place it on the ground next to your trash containers. Holiday trees larger than six-feet tall must be cut-in-half in order to be eligible for pickup. A special "tree crew" will automatically collect holiday trees that have been placed curbside during the two weeks following Christmas Day, no appointment is necessary.

Trees will be picked up on regular trash collection days, so plan accordingly. Please be sure that trees are free of decorations, tinsels, metal stands, etc. Unfortunately, flocked trees cannot be recycled. To dispose of a flocked tree, please cut-it-up and place it inside your "trash" container.
